To be accepted into a full-time University degree program, a minimum TOEFL score of 213 (computer test), 550 (paper test), or 79 (internet based) is required. Minimum passing score for the IELTS is an overall band of 6.0 or higher.

The affidavit may include a notarized letter from your sponsor and current bank statements. The I-20 Visa will be issued when this form is returned with the appropriate affidavit of support.
