Behavioral Risk Assessment Committee

What is BRAC?

- A campus risk assessment team that responds to concerns about aberrant and threatening behavior (observed or reported)
- A back-up between departments to augment existing systems when additional coordination is required
- A multidisciplinary group of professionals from several campus departments representing broad expertise

What is meant by “Behavioral Risk?”

Behavioral risk can be defined as behavior that is disruptive, intimidating, threatening or violent. This includes, but is not limited to, actions or statements by students, faculty, staff, or members of the community that express an intent to harm individuals or campus property and assets. Concerns from faculty, staff and students can come through many campus departments and programs.

Who is on the Committee?

The committee consists of representatives from Counseling Services, Student Affairs, Health Services, Safety & Security, Human Resources, Residential Education and Housing, Community Life, Experiential Education, and Deans from the College of Arts & Sciences (CAS), Westbrook College of Health Professions (WCHP), College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM), and College of Pharmacy (COP).

The committee chairs are responsible for assessing each situation and making a determination whether or not the full committee needs to be convened. Otherwise, they help to handle individual cases with existing systems. Please feel free to contact any of the BRAC members to report issues.

What kind of situations does BRAC assess?

- Personal and interpersonal violence; threats against self and/or another person/group likely to result in harm, injury or death, or to the mission of the University, for example:
- Physical or verbal abuse
- Physical assaults, injuries
- Sexual assault, including rape and sexual crimes
- Harassment, stalking
- Coercion, affronts to human dignity
- Acts of violence
- Accidents
- Hate crimes, including ethno violence and gay bashing
- Threats
- Follow-up to an incident, including suicide and homicide
- Outbursts in class
- Disruptive behavior
