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Dear Potential Residency Candidate,

The University of New England College of Pharmacy-Hannaford Pharmacy – Martin's Point Health Care PGY-1 Community Care Residency Program is currently seeking highly motivated applicants for the 2016-2017 residency year. This program has been granted candidate status by the Accreditation Services Division of the American Society of Health-Systems Pharmacists and is on track to receive full accreditation status by the culmination of the current 2015-2016 residency year. One residency position is available for the 2016-2017 year. Program activities include direct patient care services at Martin's Point Health Care and at various Hannaford Pharmacy locations, didactic and experiential teaching, community practice management, managed care practice management, and scholarly activity including a longitudinal research project.

The residency program is designed such that 60% of the resident's time will be dedicated to patient care services, 20% to teaching, 10% to practice management, and 10% to scholarly activity.

The resident will be exposed to five longitudinal and three concentrated learning experiences through their year of tenure. The primary longitudinal experiences revolve around practice management and patient care services. The pharmacy resident will gain experience working with a five-star rated Medicare Advantage Plan for the 2016 plan year and collaborating with interdisciplinary healthcare professionals working as part of the healthcare team at Martin's Point Health Care. The resident will also be involved in learning experiences at the Hannaford corporate office as well as in various Hannaford Pharmacy locations. Concentrated learning experiences include didactic teaching at UNE College of Pharmacy and experiential teaching at Martin's Point Health Care and Hannaford Pharmacy. The resident may choose concentrated electives as part of their residency experience.

Applications are to be completed online and submitted through PhORCAS. The residency NMS code is 214415. Applications received by January 8, 2016, will be reviewed and on-site interviews will be extended to qualified candidates during the months of January and February.
