**Enhanced Community Health Rotation Available in Rural Maine**

Maine AHEC Network Program Office is looking for motivated and energetic third year medical students interested to participate in a unique community-based rural Community Health Rotation in Western Maine. The new program will begin August 2015.

**Why is it Unique?**

Health care providers and community members in Western Maine (Franklin, Oxford, and Somerset Counties) have come together to create a program to ensure that students who participate have the best possible rural health experience. They have developed a program where students:

- Are mentored by trained and engaged preceptors
- Have direct one-on-one interaction with providers and patients that will build your skills and confidence
- Actively engage in the community to better understand the people and rural life by participating in a project or community activity.
- Explore interests beyond, or complementary to, clinical practice.
- **Have housing provided free of charge and mileage for one round trip to Farmington, Maine from the Biddeford campus.**

**How is This Different from the Current Community Health Rotation?**

The objectives of the Community Health Rotation are the same as those found in your COM Syllabus but AHEC has added to that experience by:

- Providing housing for the student free of charge and mileage to and from Farmington, Maine (one round trip from the Biddeford campus.)
- Creating opportunities to work with providers and community organizations to create a community experience.
- Assisting you in all aspects of this rotation.

**Application Process**

- In order to best meet the needs of the student and of the community, you will be asked to complete a short application (no more than two – three pages).
- Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis by the AHEC Program Office staff and AHEC Advisory Committee members.
- Applications should be completed **AT LEAST** 8 weeks prior to your community health rotation block.
- Approximately 1 or 3 students will be accepted for each block.
- Once accepted, you will be contacted by the AHEC Program Office to plan your experience in Western Maine.
