Director, Division Environmental Hazards & Health Effects National Center for Environmental Health U.S. Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) Adjunct Professor, Emory University School of Public Health

Dr. McGeehin has been a scientist with the CDC for over 28 years and has spent most of that time working on environmental health issues including lead poisoning in children, asthma, drinking water contamination, air pollution, radiation exposures, environmental health tracking, cancer clusters, and morbidity and mortality related to heat waves, hypothermia and extreme weather events.

Dr. McGeehin also served as co-chair of the Human Health Sector for the U.S. National Assessment Team, responsible for assessing the possible human health effects on the U.S. population resulting from global climate change.
