Program Updates

- UNE MSOT in Morocco: Three second year Master of Science in Occupational Therapy students (MSOT) and Dr. Kris Winston, MSOT Program Director, spent 10 days this past January at UNE's Tangier Campus in Morocco. They had one overnight stay in Kenitra to attend the 6th annual Occupational Therapy Association of Morocco Conference (OTAM). Our students participated in a panel with Moroccan OT students discussing how to handle stress, both as a student and while on clinical placements from the two cultural perspectives (see photos on the next page!)
- ACOTE: UNE MSOT is up for re-accreditation through the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education in the next 12 months. Our faculty and professional staff are busy preparing for this accreditation through our self-study. Our on-site visit is currently scheduled for *April 21 to 25, 2025*. - Community Partnership, Park Danforth: Faculty are excited to be exploring new partnerships with The Park Danforth. We are hoping to pilot community programming in the summer of 2024, more updates to follow!
- Trauma Informed School Based Practice Badge: We have several MSOT students working towards their Trauma Informed School Based Practice Digital Badge. Students who earn this distinction will research the neuroscience behind trauma, learn to recognize signs of trauma in the classroom, analyze student behavior through a trauma-sensitive lens, evaluate the characteristics of a safe learning environment, design a self-care plan to combat secondary traumatic stress when working in a school-based setting, and present their findings in a final project. We look forward to their final projects and work.
