# THE POMP BEHIND THE CIRCUMSTANCE

## Academic Regalia

### THE GOWN

The history of the academic gown goes back to the 12th century. During this period, everyone — both men and women, royalty, lay folk, clerics, tradesmen, students — wore long flowing robes. The apparel varied in elegance according to the rank and wealth of the owner, from simple rough worsteds to rich gold brocades wrought with tassels and trimmed with colorful velvet and rich furs. It was in this period that the first organized bodies of learning were formed. From the gowns worn in the “universities” of the period have evolved the academic costumes of today.

The bachelor's gown is a simple design falling straight from a rather elaborate yoke with long pointed sleeves. The gown worn by a master has long, closed, somewhat fuller sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees. The arms go through slits at the elbow, giving the appearance of short sleeves. The doctoral gown is cut much fuller and has large bell-shaped sleeves. The gowns are usually, but not always, black, and those of bachelors and masters are generally devoid of ornamentation. The doctoral gowns are distinguished by the five-inch velvet panel around the neck and down both sides of the front as well as by three-inch velvet bars sewn on each sleeve.

The color of the velvet trim may be black or may indicate the nature of the degree. For example, the color designating a Doctor of Philosophy is dark blue; a Doctor of Medicine, green; a Doctor of Education, light blue; a Doctor of Science, golden yellow; a Doctor of Humanities, white; a Doctor of Law, purple.

### THE HOOD

The hood seems to have had a somewhat practical origin. Medieval monks used their hoods for two purposes: to protect their shaved heads in the winter and as a container in which to collect alms.

Today, the hood serves as the most symbolic part of the academic regalia by which the observer can ascertain the wearer's level and kind of degree. The bachelor's hood is the smallest, being three feet long. The velvet trim along the edges, indicating the nature of the degree, is two inches wide. The master's hood is six inches longer and bears a three-inch velvet trim.

The doctoral hood is a full four feet long and exhibits a five-inch velvet trim, indicating the nature of the degree.

The colorful interior of the hood, visible from behind, indicates by hue the degree-granting institution. The University of New England's colors are blue and grey.

### THE CORDS AND STOLES

The cord in graduation ceremonies is used to signify a special designation or membership in an honor society. The origin of the cord is from the Catholic and Anglican churches, where cords were used to distinguish between the varying levels of clergy members.

#### Academic Honors

Undergraduate students graduating with academic honors will be recognized for their academic excellence by cords of different colors draped around their necks: summa cum laude (gold), magna cum laude (blue), cum laude (silver).

#### College of Arts and Sciences Undergraduate Honors Program

The CAS Honors Program provides high-performing students with firsthand exposure to scholarship and research. Students apply to the program and then complete and publicly defend a research-based honors thesis. They will be recognized by a solid red cord.

#### Military Service Honors

The University is proud to recognize students serving or who have served in the various military branches of the United States of America. Graduating students currently serving in the U.S. military and veterans will be recognized by a red, white, and blue cord.

#### Academic Honor Societies

Alpha Chi (National Honor Society), white stole with blue and green Greek letters; Chi Alpha Sigma (National College Athlete Honor Society), black/gold cord with tassels; Phi Alpha Theta (History), red/blue cord with mixed tassels; Psi Chi (Psychology), insignia pin, platinum/dark blue cord with mixed tassels.

#### Global Education

The Office of Global Education recognizes students who have studied abroad as part of a UNE program for one semester or more with a stole that is reflective of the flag of the country in which the student studied.

#### ISE Student Leaders

The Office of Intercultural Student Engagement honors student leaders who have worked to advance knowledge of cultural diversity and social justice. These students have served as officers of an organization in the Cultural Council or a University committee and will be recognized by a distinctive kente stole.

**KATELYN DEWATER**  
*Marine Sciences '25*

The Jacques Downs Award is an honor bestowed upon the most accomplished graduating senior in the College of Arts and Sciences. Students are nominated for this award by UNE faculty and professional staff based on the student's academic achievements, scholarly work, and service/contributions to University life during their UNE career.

The 2025 recipient of the award is Katelyn DeWater from Livonia, New York.

DeWater will graduate with a degree in Marine Sciences with a Marine Biology concentration and minors in Applied Mathematics and Geographic Information Systems (GIS). Along with her academic prowess, including Alpha Chi membership and recognition as the 2025 Outstanding Student in Marine Sciences, DeWater's name is known for research excellence within the college. She has been involved with undergraduate research projects that span the disciplines since her arrival in the fall of 2022, including in the Coral Fluorescence Lab, where she leads a team in the development of non-invasive methods to monitor coral health and has deployed these methods onsite in Belize. She completed numerous studies in the GIS Coastal Research Lab on climate change impacts on salt marshes, dunes, and coastal areas. DeWater also investigated sea level rise impacts on coastal archaeology and developed preservation protocols. She published two peer-reviewed manuscripts, has another under review, and gave 22 presentations at nine venues. DeWater's accomplishments have been recognized as being named a 2024 Goldwater Scholar, the 2025 Outstanding Undergraduate Researcher in the Natural Sciences, and she earned an honorable mention in the 2025 National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship cycle. Beyond the lab and the field, DeWater is committed to helping others understand and appreciate the planet. She is active in clubs, including Earth's Eco and Ocean Club, and she founded the Coral Club. In her free time, DeWater volunteers at the Biddeford Food Pantry and tutors math, GIS, and marine sciences at UNE. DeWater is pursuing a doctorate in ocean sciences with a concentration in air-sea interactions and remote sensing at the University of Miami this fall.

**KRYSTEN T. GORRIVAN, M.S.ED.**  
*Assistant Teaching Professor*

The Debra J. Summers Award for Teaching Excellence was created by students and named for a former Business faculty member. The annual award is given by the Undergraduate Student Government (USG) to a professor who has inspired and motivated students to reach their full potential.

The 2025 recipient is Krysten Gorrivan, M.S.Ed., from the CAS School of Education.

Gorrivan arrived at UNE in the fall of 2017, first as a teacher education fellow before joining the faculty full-time as an assistant teaching professor the following year. She is not new to teaching awards; as an elementary school teacher, she was appointed to the Unum Teacher Hall of Fame in 2010, recognized as the 2014 Biddeford Primary School Teacher of the Year, and was the recipient of the Summers Award in 2023. "KG," as she is affectionately called by students and colleagues alike, teaches myriad courses in our Education curricula as well as the senior capstone Citizenship course and independent studies for students seeking experiences beyond the traditional coursework. She routinely integrates experiential learning into her coursework, forges partnerships with local schools to enrich her students' experiences, and is the co-author of the 2023 book, *Nurturing Primary Readers in Grades K-3*. Both within and beyond the classroom, KG is widely recognized as a tireless champion of students and student wellbeing. Indeed, her office is typically filled with her current and former students and advisees who have dropped by to discuss their coursework, student-teaching, and other items of the day. And she doesn't just teach her own students; her background in trauma-informed teaching and learning has led her to help train UNE Resident Advisors on best practices as well as co-facilitating a faculty learning community to re-examine pedagogy through a trauma-informed lens. Her tireless dedication to CAS and UNE has not gone unnoticed. She was awarded the Kenneally Cup for Distinguished Academic Service in 2023. KG's experiences, expertise, consistently student-centered approach, and generosity of spirit have all contributed to her positive rapport with students and her reputation as a teacher.
