Biographical/Historical Note

Annie Finch was born in 1956 in New Rochelle, New York. She graduated from Oakwood Friends' School, a Quaker boarding school in Poughkeepsie, New York in 1973. She received her BA in English Literature from Yale in 1979, an MA in Creative Writing from the University of Houston and a PhD in English and American Literature from Stanford. Finch is a poet, author, translator, editor, and playwright and has published many books of poetry, including *Calendars*, *The Encyclopedia of Scotland*, *Among the Goddesses*, and *Eve*. She is a senior fellow at the Black Earth Institute and artist-in-residence at Cherry Hill Seminary, a leading pagan divinity school. She served as the director of the Stonecoast MFA program at the University of Southern Maine until 2013 and lives with her husband and two children in Falmouth, Maine.
