Notes: In the above chart, students are counted for each degree awarded (for example, a master's and a doctoral degree) if they earn multiple degrees at varying levels OR if multiple degrees are earned at the same level but from different colleges (a bachelor's degree from CAS and WCHP.) Degree year includes August, December and May graduates. Beginning in 2017-18, Master of Social Work online degrees are awarded through College of Professional Studies; in prior years, this degree was awarded through Westbrook College of Health Professions. Beginning 2020-21, Pharmacy degrees awarded through Westbrook College of Health Professions. Business program degrees still awarded via College of Arts and Sciences as of 2024-25. In 2025-26, business degrees awarded through College of Business and not College of Arts & Sciences.
