I am a member of the <sup>Maine</sup> ~~Women~~  
Women Veterans Commission, and a ~~Vietnam Veteran~~  
and a Vietnam Veteran.

According to the Department of  
Veterans Affairs

The estimated population of  
Women veterans in 1994 was  
1.2 m or about 4.5%  
of the total veteran population.  
Currently women make up  
11.6 % of current active  
duty military force and  
13% of the reserve force.  
With growing popularity in  
the military services  
Congress authorized expanded  
services for women veterans.

Advisory Committee on Women  
Veterans in 1983. Since 1986  
"planning for and providing for  
comprehensive health services  
to women Veterans has been  
a priority goal of Veterans  
Health Administration.  
There are approximately 9,000  
woman veterans in Maine.  
According to the Department of Defense,  
Veterans and Emergency Management as  
of July 1999 there were 1500  
WWII women Veterans ~~and~~ <sup>women</sup>  
1000 and 700 <sup>women</sup> Korean Veterans in  
the state of Maine.

The <sup>major</sup> <sup>pen</sup> of WWII women veterans by late  
Senate  
All Korean women veterans would be  
in their late 60's.  
we have <sup>VA 2100</sup> women veterans who are  
rapidly aging and who will be  
increasingly taking advantage of  
VA Services and long term care.  
(Women's medical needs are not  
as simple as men.)  
Presently the Maine Veterans Home  
will be seeing more and more  
women. Presently there <sup>are</sup> no  
women seated on the board of  
directors of the institution.

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The Penobscot Nation is in favor of a study commission to look at the possibility of a Casino in Maine. There has been much speculation and hyp about more crime, increased traffic, loss of control etc. A study would answer all of those concerns and shine some light on this proposed project.

The Penobscot Nation and the Passamaquoddy Tribe proposed a Casino as a viable and sustainable economic venture. It is working well for other tribes and states across the country.

This is a government to government proposal.

The state legislature as the policy making body of the state would be remiss and even neglectful if

they did not consider this proposal from the tribes seriously, ~~and respectfully~~ and seriously.

The 119th and the 120th (last session) approved ~~opposed~~ over fifty studies, missions from land trust, gas taxes, high speed chores to opportunities ~~etc~~ Associated with the productivity of Salmonid sport fish.

This economic opportunity has the potential of bringing thousands of jobs to Maine and millions of dollars to the state coffers.

Tribal governments deserve to be treated with respect and their proposal merits serious consideration and study by policy makers of this state.

I urge you ~~to~~ to oppose this study.
