

Catalyzing Planetary Health Engagement at a University Jennifer Gunderman, MPH & Holly Parker, MEd

The University of New England demonstrates that an institution with diverse constituencies and interests can be quickly mobilized through a faculty and student grassroots initiative supported by innovation strategies.

Background & Methods

The University of New England (UNE), Maine's largest private university, participated in and implemented activities to identify ways to integrate PH across the university's six colleges. With the tagline, "Innovation for a Healthier Planet", UNE is committed to finding solutions to global issues through curriculum, research, and community engagement.

Delegation of faculty, staff, and students attended the 2017 PHA conference \rightarrow creation of an inclusive, interdisciplinary steering committee representing all colleges at UNE. Goals included:

- Identify existing UNE PH initiatives (research, education, community action)
- Build collaboration across colleges and units
- Engage with the larger UNE community on PHA related issues.

Utilizing *design thinking approaches*, such as a World Café, strategic planning resulted in:

- Coordination of PHA related activities
- Development of digital identity and communications via webpages and social media.

- Extend PH engagement to local community and other academic institutions.
- Foster interdisciplinary PH research and education initiatives.
