CALENDAR

The University of New England operates on a 15-week, semester-based academic calendar with fall and spring semesters, plus additional summer sessions and accelerated terms as applicable. The College of Osteopathic Medicine follows a year-round academic calendar running from July through June, with the first two academic years divided into two instructional halves.

CREDIT HOUR DEFINITION

For each academic credit assigned to a course, students spend one (1) hour per week in class, and two (2) hours on out-of-class assignments per each hour of in-class instruction.

REPEAT TO REPLACE COURSE POLICY

A student may repeat a course to improve their grade. However, only the second or last course taken will receive credit on the student's transcript, and only the second or last grade received will be calculated into the cumulative GPA. Transfer courses cannot be taken to replace a grade.

Grades for repeated courses taken will be marked in the Repeat column (labeled R) on the transcript. **E/I** (Excluded/Included) to the right of the course listing indicates repeated course; only the last instance will calculate into the GPA. **A** (Applied to GPA) to the right of the course indicates a course initially taken at UNE but then repeated for credit at another institution.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Students must have earned at least a C- to transfer in a course. Transfer credits appear on the transcript with a TR grade and do not count toward the GPA.
