Trailblazer Trip Descriptions

Research Science

Working with renowned UNE faculty you will participate in several research projects on and off campus. Projects may include shark research, kelp farming, American Chestnut research, participation in avian research, and more! We will be sure to have some fun exploring the Biddeford area too! Exact projects are subject to research need and adverse weather.

Canoe Camping

What better than to spend four days with your new friends paddling the lakes of Western Maine and Northern New Hampshire? This program partners with the Appalachian Mountain Club to provide an outstanding opportunity to explore the wilderness of Maine & NH by canoe. While camping, students will engage with their peers and enjoy the time spent outdoors, sleeping in tents, and cooking meals on small camp stoves. Students should be comfortable in a canoe, but no experience is necessary.

Wellness Wayfarer

Partnering with UNE's Health and Wellness Educator, this four day trip to Newry, ME focuses on whole body wellness. Start your day with yoga, head to the local market to learn about nutrition, then return to your lodge and prepare your community feast. Immerse yourself in healthy living while making fast friends with those around you!

Creeks and Crags

This is a four-day, three-night outdoor learning experience partnering with The Appalachian Mountain Club and focusing on life at UNE. Students will be transported to The White Mountains to explore and experience all that the Pinkham Notch region has to offer. Waterfalls, rivers, hikes, and an overnight away from the road! Students will work together to prepare meals and carry out community chores. Students should be comfortable hiking and canoeing 1-3+ miles a day, but no experience is required.

Wild Waters

Are you ready for adventure? Join us for this fantastic whitewater-kayaking trip with the Appalachian Mountain Club. From your base camp in Pinkham Notch, NH you will explore the wild rivers of the north country for four days and three nights learning new techniques and skills along the way. Each morning you will wake from your tents and travel to a new river of increasing difficulty, then return to base camp for a hearty home cooked meal before stargazing the night away. No experience is necessary.

Momentous Mountains

If you are a hiker, this is the trip for you. This is a four-day, three night outdoor learning experience partnering with The Appalachian Mountain Club and focusing on life at UNE. Students will hike from campsite to campsite in the historic White Mountains. While camping, students will engage with their peers and enjoy the time spent outdoors, sleeping in tents, and cooking meals on small camp stoves. Students should be comfortable hiking 3-5+ miles a day over moderate terrain with a backpack. Experience is recommended though not required.

Nomadic Nor'Easters

This is a four day trip where students will interact with surrounding cities such as Boston and Portland, in order to gain an understanding of the many diverse cultures around us. Students will travel to Boston and explore different subsections of the city before returning to UNE and exploring Portland. This will be a great opportunity for students who are interested in studying abroad and learning more about cultural diversity.

Kayak Adventure

This is a four day outdoor learning experience partnering with Rippleffect and focusing on life at UNE. Students will ride the ferry out to scenic Cow Island in historic Casco Bay where they will prepare for a kayaking trip across Casco Bay. Each day you will kayak to a new island to explore. Set up camp, cook meals together, and maybe see the northern lights! This trip will be camping away from modern facilities in tents that you carry with you in your kayak. Students should be comfortable around water and in outdoor situations, but no experience is required.

Island Adventure

This is a four day outdoor learning experience partnering with Rippleffect and focusing on life at UNE. Students will ride the ferry out to scenic Cow Island in historic Casco Bay where they will spend three nights. During this trip, students will do some entry-level sea kayaking around Cow Island, ride the 400' zip line, climb on a climbing wall, and enjoy the camaraderie of new friendships around campfires at night. Students will work together to prepare meals and carry out community chores. Students should be comfortable around water and in outdoor situations, but no experience is required.
