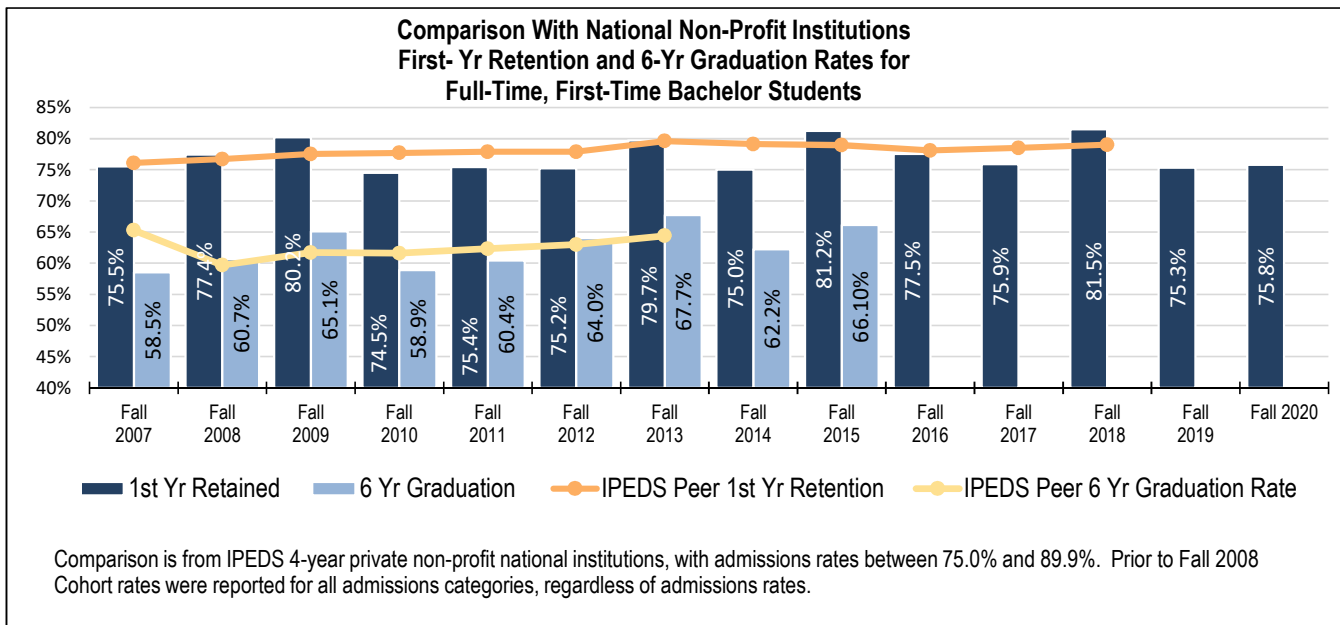

* Students, such as Pre-Pharmacy students, who selected into a UNE graduate program prior to graduating with a bachelor's degree are excluded from the cohort when calculating graduation rates.

Notes:

1. Persistence of 3+2 program (Athletic Training) students will be tracked for 4 years (150% of normal time to complete the undergraduate portion).
2. Persistence of the 2+4 program (Pre-Pharmacy) will be tracked for 3 years (150% of normal time to complete the undergraduate portion).
3. Return rates include students who are still enrolled and students who graduated.
4. Students are considered in the starting cohort if they began their program in the summer or fall and were enrolled on October 15th.
5. In cases where a later return rate is higher than a previous year return rate for a single cohort it's because of leave of absences who return.
